Council Members met with Congressman Blake Moore to discuss and conduct site visits of the Weber Watershed Partnership and Project, High Valley Transit District, and the bus rapid transit corridor. (1:30 P.M.)

1:30 p.m. Those present introduced themselves. Representative Moore invited direct contact to Ms. Roskelley. Interim County Manager Janna Young thanked the Congressman for his office's responsiveness and helping with the community grant that the County received. The tour will include the watershed site and transit hub site.

1:36 p.m. Jess Kirby, Public Lands Manager, provided background on the watershed project. Discussions started in 2018 following the Duchesne Fire. Those discussions focused in on how to do cross boundary work. The National Forest Service and World Resource Institute have been a huge resource in figuring out how to bring money to in to address the issue. The County is improving roads and asking for grants from the American the Beautiful grant program. The County is trying to get a forest service official out to the County and would love to have the forest chief visit because the designations in their fire risk maps are incorrect. Recent federal legislation excluded Utah from the high risk fire landscape, which limits the money available to Utah to do this work.

Those present provided additional background about the County's natural resources and current issues facing the County.
