What is the purpose of the RAP Tax?

- To enhance or support the funding of publicly owned or operated recreational and zoological facilities, and botanical, cultural, and zoological organizations owned operated by institutions or private nonprofit organizations.



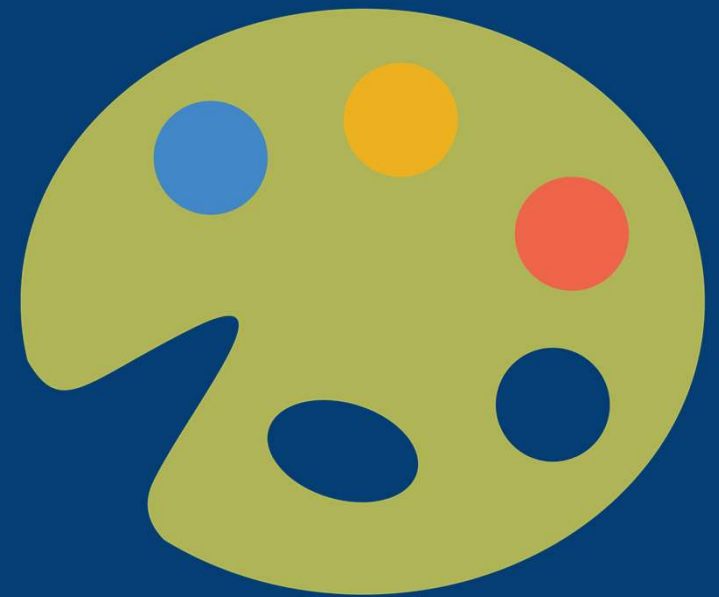
About the RAP Tax:

- “RAP” stands for: Recreation, Arts and Parks.
- It is a county-wide sales tax and is a 0.10% (tenth of a cent) sales tax on certain goods to help support recreation, arts and parks in Summit County.
- Taxes WILL NOT increase if the RAP Tax passes in 2020 because it has been in place for 20 years.
- Citizens of Summit County first voted to approve this tax in 2000, then renewed the tax in 2010. It will expire at the end of 2020 unless renewed.



Where have RAP Tax funds been distributed?

- **Bonded recreation projects such as...**
 - Expanded facilities for Basin Recreation and Park City Municipal
 - The Red Barn in Oakley City
 - Park and playground facilities in the North Summit Recreation District
 - And more!
