Summit County Junior Livestock Committee – 2020 Show & Sale Summary

- Summit County Fairground – Livestock Facilities
 - Visitors and other outside individuals have commented on how impressive the facilities are and the overall presentation of the show, sale, and animals.
 - Improvements made thus far:
 - Additional shade clothes
 - Heavy duty wash bays – built, portable, set up in swine barn
 - Steer Barn hitching rail extended
 - Improvements coming or in discussion:
 - Requesting replacing cobble rock with smaller gravel or extending/adding walk or entry paths. Cobble rock is causing several falls already.
 - Extending asphalt from hog barn to move wash bay further out of hog barn, additional wash bay or tie up area between steer and lamb barn.
 - Fans in sale barn, similar to fans in lamb barn.
